- Camper Conduct Policy
- Emergency Procedures
- Total Fire Ban regulations

We also take your complaints seriously and if you have any concerns with fellow patrons please let us know immediately and we will address the situation, however if you are the cause or found to be in breach of the rules and regulations, management reserve the right to remove you from site immediately.

Please do not hesitate to contact the main office or the caretaker after hours at any time.

Sewage Treatment System

The new treatment facility relies on bacteria to break down organic waste. **It is important to not deposit contents of chemical toilet tanks (cassettes) into this facility.** Foreign material or chemicals will seriously disrupt the operation of this system. If you are found in breach of the above fees will apply.

The **outdoor showers** beside the ramp access to the amenity block are to be used to **rinse sand off prior to showering in the amenity block.** Please **don't rinse out your wetsuits in the amenity block;** sand will accumulate and disrupt the system.

Camper Conduct Policy

Campers are expected to be mindful of their fellow campers and not interfere with their peaceful camping.

Therefore:

- No pets are allowed in the park
- Be tidy & respect other campers
- Drunk & disorderly conduct and underage drinking will not be tolerated
- Offensive behaviour will not be tolerated
- Wrap food waste before placement in bins, preferably in a plastic bag
- Due to limited space no bikes, skateboards, or inline skates, etc. are allowed
- No ball games or frisbees, etc.
- Cars must be parked within the boundaries of your site
- Only one car per site
- All beach access tracks must be kept clear at all times
- No fires are permitted in the park or on the beach at any time
- All campers must comply with the no noise policy after 11pm

General Emergency Procedures

In the case of fire or any other threat / risk:

- Alert all persons nearby and request assistance
- Assist any person in immediate danger (only if safe to do so)
- Call the **Fire Brigade / Police / Ambulance on 000** & notify the Reserve Ranger on (03) 5289 0412
- If threat to life exists, evacuate immediately, closing all doors
- Close the door on the fire to contain spread
- Isolate electricity (only if safe to do so)
- Shut off gas cylinders (only if safe to do so)
- Extinguish the fire (only if safe to do so)
- In the case of any emergency **the beach is the designated assembly point**. All campers are asked to familiarise themselves with the best route from their site to the beach.
- In the case of fire the first response may need to come from patrons, therefore all campers are asked to familiarise themselves with the location of the nearest fire hose reel.
- Campground staff will assist with hose reels and the campground's mobile fire kit

Total Fire Ban Days

On days of Total Fire Ban the use of the following is prohibited inside & outside Caravan Annexes and Tents according to CFA Regulations:

- Gas & Electric BBQ's; Frypans; Woks; or any other portable or fixed domestic appliance designed exclusively for meal preparation and fired by gas or electricity; also candles; gas or kerosene lanterns & kerosene stoves; gas refrigerators
- NOTE: These items may be used inside a caravan but not in an annex or outside the caravan

BUSHFIRE URGENT THREAT ALARM

If you are holidaying in Wye River you should discuss with your family what will be **your bushfire plan**.

On days of high fire danger if your decision is to leave, then **leave early**,

if your decision is to stay, or there is insufficient time to leave, **you need to be prepared**.

Your bushfire plan should include the following:

- **Personnel protection** for your family, cover them in long sleeved shirt, long pants, sturdy shoes or boots and a hat;
- **Close** your cabin/ caravan **doors & windows**;
- **Remove your gas bottles** and take to the beach;
- Time permitting: **pack up tents and canvas annexes**;
- Leave all vehicles at your site.

IN THE EVENT OF AN IMMEDIATE BUSHFIRE ATTACK A CONTINUOUS UNINTERRUPTED SIREN WILL SOUND

The Emergency Assembly Area is the beach. Take with you: **identification, money, a woollen blanket for each family member** (for protection against an ember attack) **battery radio, torch, sunscreen, water, medication & toiletries**.
